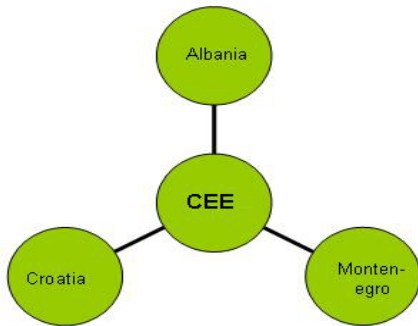
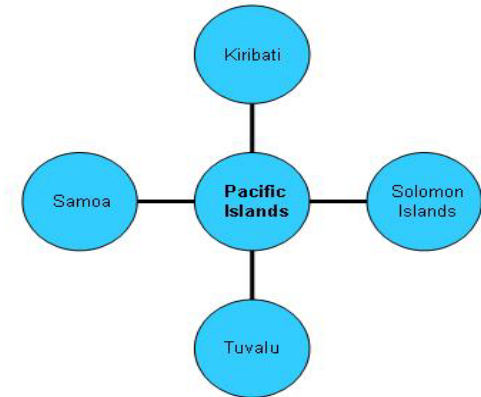
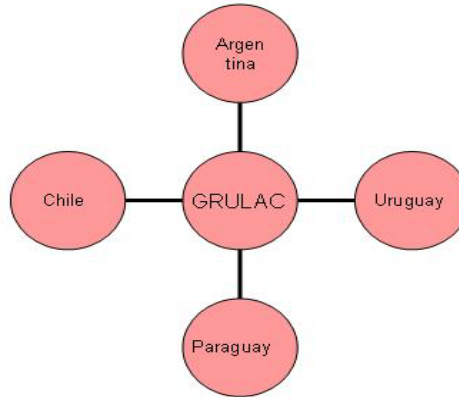
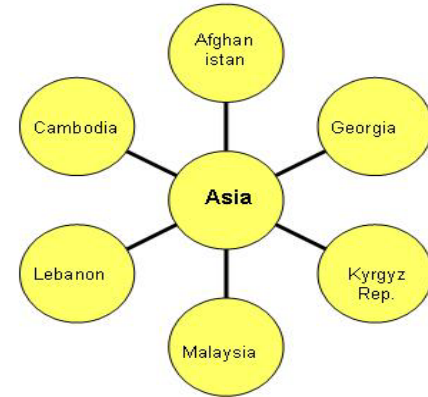
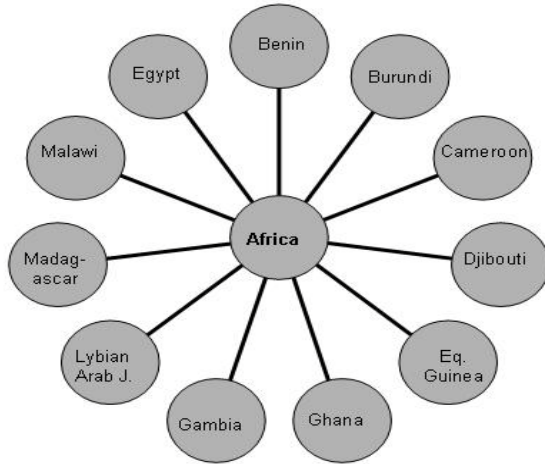
National Implementation Plan on POPs

- > 60 countries to develop their NIPs
- a lessons learned on NIP development prepared from regional meetings (2006)
- contributed to NIP development guidance
- NIPs updates for 28 countries in five regions, further submissions planned
- Capacity building for LDCs





UNEP's NIP Updating

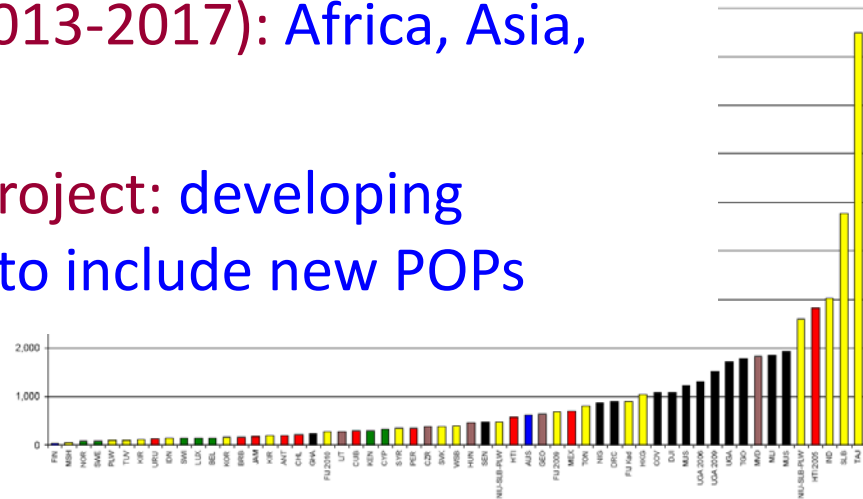


Global Monitoring Plan (GMP) on POPs

To build regional capacity on analysis and data generation for POPs in core matrices (ambient air and human milk)

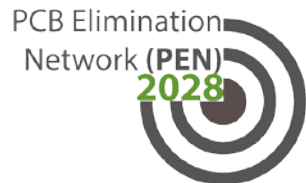


- Phase I projects (2009-2012): Africa, GRULAC and Pacific
- Phase II projects (2013-2017): Africa, Asia, GRULAC, Pacific
- UNEP/GEF Global project: developing methods and tools to include new POPs into the GMP





PCB Activities



UNEP Provides Secretariat Services to the PCB Elimination Network

UNEP projects on PCB management:

1. Regional approaches in Africa for PCB management
2. PCB management in the mining sector in South America





DDT Activities



UNEP provides Secretariat Services to DDT Alliance for the Development and Deployment of Alternatives to DDT for Disease Vector Control

- UNEP is currently implementing a Programme on Demonstrating and scaling-up on sustainable alternatives to DDT in vector management
- Activities carried out in Africa, Asia, Central America and Western Pacific

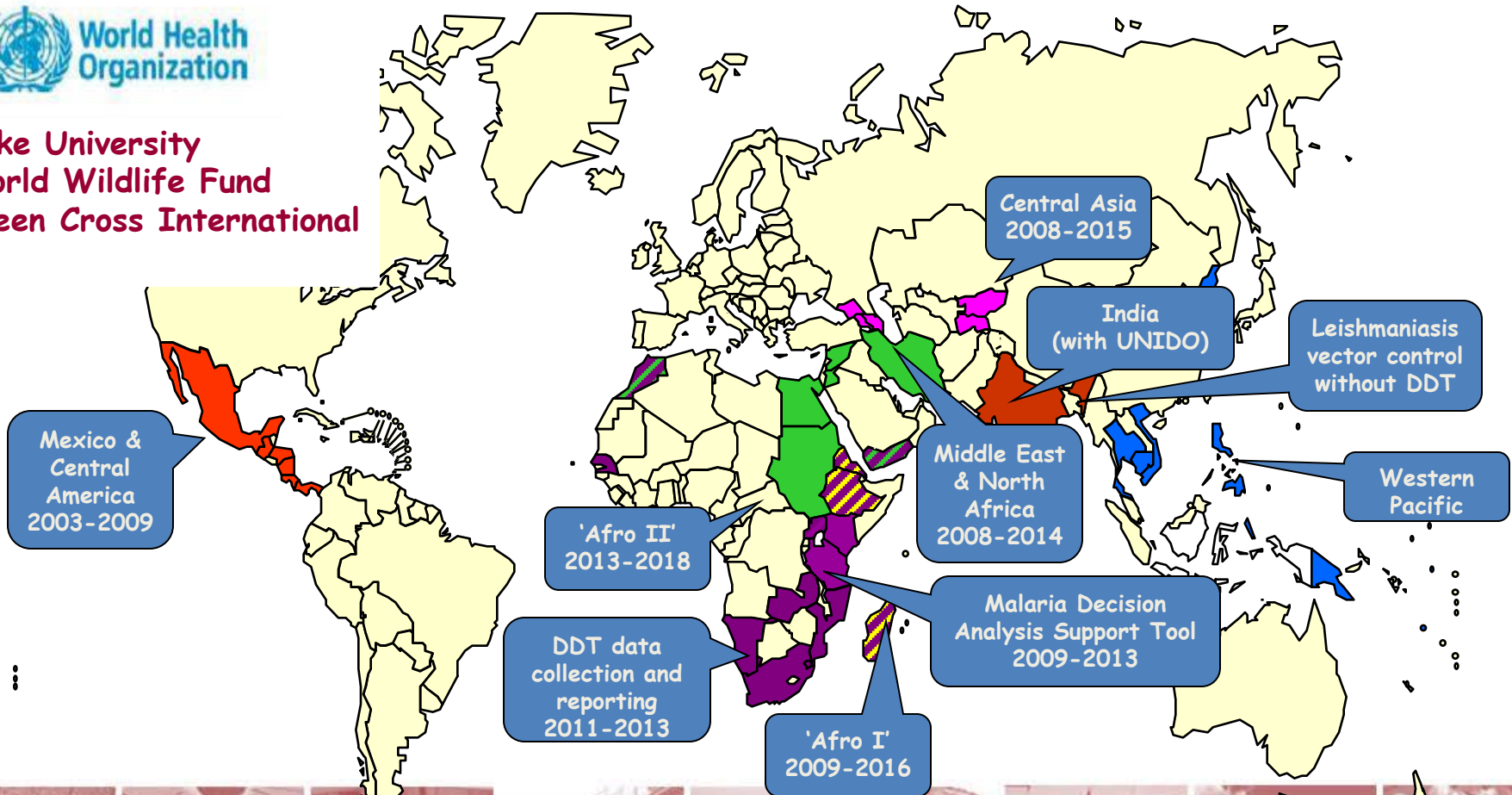

POPs reporting and dissemination of information

- Pilot activities on the design and implementation of Pollutant Release and Transfer (PRTRs) as a tool to report to the Stockholm Convention and disseminate information to all sectors
- Three regions, six countries



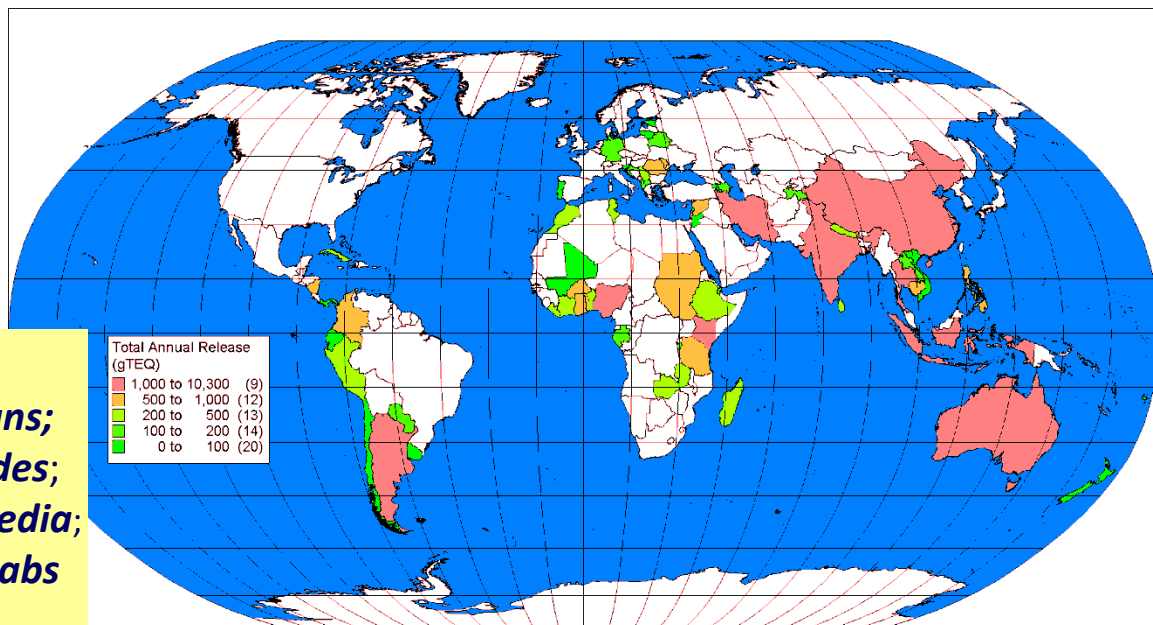
New POPs regional assessment

- Project on Subregional Action Plan for PBDE Management in Asia
- Includes demonstration of application of BAT/BEP in priority sectors and will propose a regional pollution control strategy and national frameworks in Asia



Toolkits and Guidance

- Contributions to technical guidance
- Dioxin/furan toolkit
- Laboratory capacity



- **85 laboratories from 40 countries**
- **82% of labs: results OK for dioxins/furans;**
- **62% of labs results OK for POPs pesticides;**
- **difficulties with certain samples and media;**
- **differences OECD: developing country labs small**
